## Seminar Report

Two-Day Multilingual International Seminar on Voices from the Margins: Revisiting Birsa

Munda and Other Significant Tribal Movements

Dates: 15th and 16th November 2021

Birsa Munda College organised a Two-Day Multilingual International Seminar titled "Voices from the Margins: Revisiting Birsa Munda and Other Significant Tribal Movements" on November 15th and 16th, 2021. The aim of the seminar was to critically examine the voices and experiences of marginalised communities, paying particular attention to the legacy of Birsa Munda and other tribal movements that have significantly shaped the socio-political landscape.





The seminar comprised multiple technical sessions chaired by eminent personalities from academia and social activism. The programme commenced with Mr. Gautam Deb, Chairperson of the Board of Administrator, Siliguri Municipal Corporation, inaugurating the event by lighting the lamp, symbolising the enlightenment and auspicious beginning of the seminar. Mr. Deb also delivered the welcome address, extending warm greetings to all attendees and emphasising the significance of the seminar.







The first technical session on November 15th, 2021 was chaired by Dr. Nimai Chandra Saha, Vice-Chancellor of Burdwan University. Discussions revolved around the cultural preservation efforts of tribal communities amidst modernisation and globalisation. The session concluded with a vibrant exchange of ideas, enriching the understanding of tribal struggles and resilience.

On November 16th, 2021, the third technical session was chaired by Dr. SP Tiwari. Presentations by Dr. Subodh Hansda from Rabindra Bharati University and Dr. Himangshu Kumar from Kalyani University shed light on contemporary issues faced by tribal populations. Dr. Birendra Mridha,
